## 2025 Community Capacity Building Funding (CCBF) – Health Share of Oregon Funding Priorities



The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) has allocated Health Share \$15.40M for distribution in 2025. This funding supports organizations to increase their ability to become providers of the new Health Related Social Need (HRSN) benefits to eligible OHP members.

Health Share is prioritizing funding for organizations based on network need and demonstrated organizational readiness/capacity to serve members living in Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington counties. All funding must be spent by 9/30/27. See page 2 for additional application guidance.

- Permissible and non-permissible uses of funding are listed in the application. Capitol expenses are not permissible for this grant.
- Health Share will not be awarding funding to organizations who want to provide HRSN climate devices.
